A CHILD’S FUTURE BEGINS AT HOME

From a recent devotional in *Our Daily Bread*:

The village vicar couldn’t sleep. As World War II raged, he told a group of American soldiers they could not bury their fallen comrade in the fenced cemetery next to his church. Only church members could be buried there. The men had no choice but to bury their friend just outside the fence.

The next morning the men couldn’t find their friend’s grave. “What happened? The grave is gone,” one soldier told the reverend. The reverend explained that the grave was still there. He said, “I regretted telling you no. So, last night I got up... and I moved the fence.”

Over the past five years, we have partnered with more than a dozen churches to shelter families through the rotational model. Dozens more worked to provide support through donations of time and money. Quarantine, closures, and social distancing have presented roadblocks to the continuation of our rotational model. We have prayed without ceasing for our families and asked God to guide us in our quest to find shelter for them.

Like the vicar in the devotional above, God called on us to look at the challenge placed before us with fresh eyes. Could we move from a rotational model to sheltering families in apartments and houses? Would a scattered site model be feasible? We held leases on three apartments. Could we meet the needs of so

many families with this space? We discussed how we could still provide case management and partner with the congregations to meet the families' needs. We wondered how we could find properties and landlords who would share our new vision for shelter. We shared these ideas with church coordinators. And then we prayed some more.

The God of miracles provided for us once again. Churches came forward offering parsonages that were unused by pastors and rental properties they owned that were currently empty. We signed leases for three beautiful houses and two amazing apartments! All of these from our church community. It would seem that as with the vicar, **God had moved the fence for us.**

The prophet Isaiah shared God's word with the people of Israel:

"Do not remember the former things, Nor consider the things of old. Behold, I will do a new thing, Now it shall spring forth; Shall you not know it? I will even make a road in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.

A scattered site shelter is an apartment or house where a single family lives while receiving case management. We currently have eight shelter units throughout the county. We have been blessed to work with St. John Bosco Catholic Church, Edinburg Lutheran Parish, and Mt. Zion Lutheran Church in New Market as well as private landlords. We have found that using this model is less traumatic for families and children; and, in most cases, they are able to quickly find employment and childcare to stabilize their situation.

Several community groups have “adopted” one of the shelter sites by decorating and stocking the unit to welcome families. *One mother who recently moved in was overwhelmed that someone had taken the time to make the place so homey – the beds were even made! After couch-surfing and living in their car for weeks, her son was so excited to have their own bath tub - he started filling it right away to take a bath!!*
