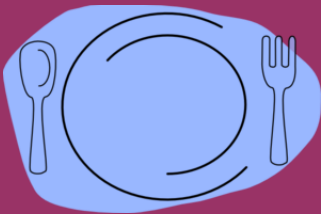

Case Manager's Corner

Good News! FPSC now has 3 Transitional Housing (TH) units! We helped Maranda and her daughter, Amy, move into their 2 BR apartment recently and it is now completely furnished!



While families are in the TH program, I provide additional case management services and life skills. One program they participate in is the *Keys to Good Tenancy Program* (KGTP). This provides families with the knowledge and skills to be good tenants. They receive a certificate of completion which can be given to their new landlord to show they can be a good neighbor and tenant.

Three families are currently participating in KGTP – one in the Shelter Program and two in TH. *The Keys to Good Tenancy Program* is divided into 8 modules:

- Setting Goals
- Finding a Place to Rent
- Understanding Your Lease
- Moving Day
- Household Budgeting
- Cleaning, Organizing, and Maintenance
- Being A Good Neighbor
- Renter's Rights

Although the information is the same, there is some difference in how quickly a family can progress through the modules, each may take up to 45 minutes (depending on the amount of discussion). The current family in the Shelter Program is working through the modules with the goal of being completed prior to moving into their apartment. A family in the TH program will have different goals and the program can be extended out for a longer period of time.

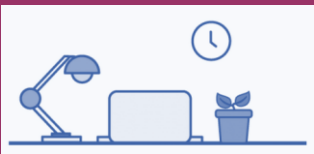
